Modern revealed preference approaches to measuring consumers' demands for non-market, environmental resources require a detailed understanding of micro-econometrics. The research frontier has outpaced standard course work and packaged software programs. This workshop responds to these needs. It offers training by experts-those micro-econometricians developing tomorrow's methods- and provides an understanding of the implications for choice models, software capable of implementing the new methods, and experience with real world examples.

Why You Should Attend:

Learn how to use Matlab for Classical & Bayesian econometric simulation methods for mixed logit choice models, generalized corner solutions models, equilibrium sorting models, mixed discrete/continuous models, and more. After attending the workshop, participants will have a working knowledge of these models, software to implement them, and experience in applying them to relevant environmental problems.

Who Should Attend:

The workshop is targeted to applied researchers in environmental economics with experience in practical dimensions of micro-econometric modeling. Young professionals in academic, government, and consulting positions are especially encouraged to attend. A limited number of registrations are reserved for advanced graduate students.

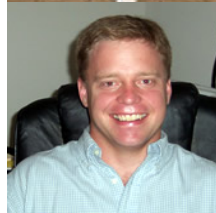
