## JOB MARKET PAPER

"Household Preferences for School Bus Transportation: Survey Evidence from Wake County, North Carolina"

• **Abstract**: Despite widespread recognition and availability, the yellow school bus is not how the majority of American public schoolchildren get to and from school each day. Rather, the private vehicle dominates school transportation and this trend shows little to no signs of changing. Increased private vehicle usage generates significant costs to the individual student's household, as well as the surrounding community. This suggests a friction between existing school bus service and potential bus riders. To investigate preferences for school transportation, I designed and fielded a web survey investigating household preferences for school bus transportation in the Wake County Public School System, the largest school district in North Carolina. Leveraging double-bounded dichotomous choice information, I find that survey respondents value their students' time at a rate of \$25.20 per hour. Additionally, respondents would be willing to pay \$18.79 to avoid a delay or cancellation of school bus service.
